A Little Compassion Goes a Long Way

The goal of Young-Williams Animal Center is to find loving forever homes for the thousands of animals that come through our doors each year. However, not all of these animals are ready for adoption due to medical conditions or behavioral issues. Because we are an open-intake facility and the official animal shelter for Knox County and the City of Knoxville, we turn no animal away regardless of its condition. That is why the Harry and Carolyn Galbraith Animal Compassion Fund was established.

The Animal Compassion Fund provides the resources needed to treat various medical conditions, including injured or broken limbs, as well as conditions like kidney disease and heart murmurs. Without the Animal Compassion Fund the future of the animals would be uncertain.

One of those animals saved by the Animal Compassion Fund is 1-year-old Dobby, who had both hind legs broken after being hit by a car. Dobby had hope thanks to the Harry and Carolyn Galbraith Animal Compassion Fund. The in-house medical team at Young-Williams Animal Center set both back legs, cleaned her wounds and provided pain relief. Several surgeries, gentle foster care, physical therapy and lots of love later, Dobby is on her way to a happy, healthy life.
